***Roof Replacement Service – Sand Shed***

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# INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

## 1. INVITATION AND OVERVIEW

Cypress County (County) invites qualified roofing contractors (Proponents) to submit proposals for the replacement of fabric cover on the existing 80' x 150' freestanding Diamond Shelter structure located at 737 – 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue, Dunmore. Scope includes removal and disposal of the existing cover, supply of all new cover components and hardware, and complete reinstallation of the new cover system.

The County will receive sealed tenders until 2:00pm MST on June 24, 2026. Faxed tenders will not be accepted and will be returned to the Proponent.

A mandatory site meeting will be held June 17, 10am

## 2. BACKGROUND

The County owns and operates a diverse portfolio of buildings. Cypress County is undertaking roof replacement of the Sand Shed to maintain the facility and address identified roofing deficiencies.

## 3. OBJECTIVES

The objectives of this project are to: Replace aging roofing systems; Improve building envelope integrity; Reduce leaks and moisture intrusion; Enhance energy efficiency where feasible; Minimize operational disruptions; Obtain long-term warranty protection. Warranty details; Expected service life. Acceptable systems may include SBS modified bitumen, TPO membrane, EPDM membrane, or equivalent systems suitable for Alberta climate conditions.

## 4. SUBMISSION OF TENDERS

The County reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to accept or reject any proposal in whole or in part, to waive informalities and irregularities, and to cancel, amend, or re-issue this RFP at any time. A Proponent may withdraw its proposal at any time before the Submittal Deadline by providing written notice to the County. After the Submittal Deadline, proposals may not be withdrawn or amended except with the County's written consent. Negligence or mistake on the part of the Proponent in preparing the proposal confers no right for withdrawal of the proposal after closing.

## 8. GUARANTEE

Prices are to be valid for a period of 30 days after the quotation closing time to allow for evaluation of bids and award of contract.

## 9. ACCESS TO INFORMATION

Proponents are advised that Cypress County is a public body subject to Alberta's **Access to Information Act (ATIA)** and **Protection of Privacy Act (POPA)**. Information submitted to the County may be subject to access requests and disclosure in accordance with ATIA, subject to any applicable exceptions. The County will protect personal information in its custody or control, and will collect, use, and disclose personal information in accordance with POPA. Proponents should clearly identify any information in their proposal that they believe is

confidential or proprietary; however, the County does not guarantee that such information will be withheld from disclosure if required by law.

## 10.EVALUATION AND SELECTION

Proposals will be evaluated by a County evaluation committee. The County may, at its discretion, request clarifications, conduct interviews, and/or negotiate scope and fees with one or more Proponents. The County is not obligated to accept the lowest-priced proposal.

## 11.LAW AND FORUM OF PROPOSAL

This Request for Proposal and any resulting contract shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Province of Alberta and the applicable laws of Canada. By submitting a quotation, the Proponent irrevocably attorns to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of Alberta for the resolution of any disputes arising out of or relating to this Request for Proposal or any resulting contract.

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### 12. SCOPE OF WORK

The successful proponent shall provide all labour, materials, supervision, tools, equipment, permits, transportation, disposal, and incidentals necessary to complete the roof replacement project. The work includes:

12.1 Removal of existing fabric cover including all associated hardware and strapping.

12.2 Disposal of removed cover materials.

12.3 Supply of replacement fabric cover system for 80' x 150' Diamond Shelter freestanding building, including 12oz. white fire-rated panels, high-tension roof tightening system, cover joint kits, end chuck flap tightening system, and all associated lashing winches, straps, ratchets and fasteners.

12.4 Installation of all cover panels, tensioning systems, straps, winches, and hardware per manufacturer specifications.

12.5 Site cleanup and waste removal;

12.6 Final inspection and warranty documentation.

The Proponent shall provide deliverables meeting the requirements below. Deliverables must be clear, and complete.

The Contractor is responsible for the removal and proper disposal of all materials associated with the work. In keeping with the County's commitment to environmental stewardship, materials shall be recycled where feasible and otherwise disposed of in accordance with all applicable regulations and accepted environmental practices.

All deliverables produced become the property of the County upon payment, subject to any pre-existing Proponent intellectual property in standard templates/tools.

## 14. SCHEDULE

The County requires that all roofing repair work be fully completed no later than October 14, 2026. Proponents shall submit a detailed work schedule demonstrating how this completion date will be achieved.

## 15. ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

### 15.1 County Responsibilities

Project Administration

## SCOPE OF WORK

- Designate a County representative to administer the contract and coordinate internal stakeholders.

### Site Access

- Provide reasonable access to the facility and coordinate operational requirements and restricted areas.

### Information Provided

- Provide available drawings, reports, and known site condition information.

### Approvals

- Review contractor submissions, change orders, and payment applications within a reasonable timeframe.

### Utilities

- Provide reasonable access to existing utility services unless otherwise specified.

### Occupancy and Operations

- Coordinate facility schedules and communicate operational requirements to minimize disruptions.

### Payments

- Process progress payments and statutory holdbacks in accordance with contract requirements and legislation.

## 15.2 Proponent Responsibilities

### Project Management

- Provide a designated Project Manager as primary point of contact
- Coordinate all labour, materials, equipment, and Subcontractors
- Schedule and manage all work activities

### Site Safety

- Comply with all provincial and federal safety legislation
- Provide fall protection systems and worker training
- Conduct hazard assessments and daily toolbox meetings
- Report incidents and near misses to the County

### Permits and Compliance

- Obtain and pay for all permits required for the work
- Ensure compliance with building codes and applicable regulations
- Coordinate inspections required by authorities having jurisdiction

### Protection of Property

- Protect the building, occupants, equipment, and adjacent property
- Provide temporary weather protection during roof removal and installation
- Prevent water intrusion and damage to facility contents
- Repair any damage caused by construction activities

### Construction Activities

- Remove existing roofing materials and complete installation of the new roofing system in accordance with contract requirements.

### Quality Control

## SCOPE OF WORK

- Ensure all work complies with manufacturer specifications and correct deficiencies at no additional cost.

### Environmental Responsibilities

- Maintain a clean site and properly dispose of waste materials in accordance with regulations.

### Documentation:

- Submit schedules, warranty documents, inspection reports, and final completion documentation.

### Security

- Secure the construction site and control access during the project.

## 16. EXISTING CONDITIONS

Proponents are responsible for reviewing and verifying all existing site conditions prior to submission. Quantities, dimensions and existing conditions are approximate and must be independently confirmed by the contractor.

**PRICING**

Proponents shall provide lump sum pricing in Canadian dollars, exclusive of applicable taxes, and inclusive of all labour, travel, subsistence, equipment, printing (if any), and other expenses necessary to complete the roof repairs. Proponents shall price each portion of the facility separately. Additionally, proponents shall include an hourly rate sheet for labour craft and equipment for any found or additional work.

# MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

This Memorandum of Agreement (the "Agreement") is made effective as of the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2026, by and between Cypress County, a municipal corporation in the Province of Alberta (the "County"), and \_\_\_\_\_ (the "Contractor"). The County and the Contractor may be referred to individually as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties."

The Parties agree that this Agreement sets out the terms under which the Contractor will provide preventative maintenance program development and related consulting services for Cypress County buildings, as more particularly described in the Request for Proposal, the Contractor's submission, and any mutually agreed written amendments, all of which are incorporated into this Agreement to the extent they are consistent with this Agreement.

## 1. SERVICES

The Contractor shall perform the services described in the Request for Proposal, the Contractor's proposal, and any written scope refinements approved by the County. The Contractor shall provide the services diligently, professionally, and in accordance with the standard of care, skill, and diligence ordinarily exercised by qualified contractor performing similar services in Alberta.

## 2. TERM AND SCHEDULE

This Agreement shall commence on the effective date and shall continue until the services are completed, unless terminated earlier in accordance with this Agreement. The Contractor shall perform the services in compliance with the schedule required by the Request for Proposal and any schedule accepted by the County in writing.

## 3. COMPENSATION

In consideration of the Contractor's performance of the services, the County shall pay the Contractor the fees set out in the accepted quotation, plus applicable taxes, subject to satisfactory performance and receipt of invoices acceptable to the County. Unless otherwise agreed in writing, the Contractor is responsible for all costs and expenses incurred in performing the services.

The Parties acknowledge that, where applicable, payments under this Agreement shall be administered in accordance with Alberta's Prompt Payment and Construction Lien Act. Without limiting the foregoing, the County may retain the statutory holdback required by law, including a 10% holdback from the value of the work actually done or materials actually furnished, and any release of holdback shall occur in accordance with the applicable lien periods and statutory requirements. Proper invoices, payment timelines, notices of dispute, and any related rights or obligations shall be governed by the Act to the extent the Act applies to the Work.

## 4. CONTRACTOR OBLIGATIONS

- The Contractor shall provide qualified personnel and adequate supervision for the services.
- The Contractor shall comply with all applicable laws, regulations, bylaws, safety requirements, and professional standards.

# MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

- The Contractor shall promptly advise the County of any issue that may affect scope, schedule, cost, or deliverables.
- The Contractor shall not assign or subcontract the Agreement, in whole or in part, without the County's prior written consent.

## 5. COUNTY OBLIGATIONS

The County shall provide reasonable access to available information, records, and facilities necessary for the Contractor to perform the services, and shall review and respond to submitted deliverables within a reasonable time.

## 6. OWNERSHIP AND CONFIDENTIALITY

All reports, working papers, spreadsheets, maintenance libraries, and other deliverables prepared specifically for the County under this Agreement shall become the property of the County upon payment of the fees properly due for them, subject to the Contractor's ownership of any pre-existing proprietary tools, templates, methodologies, or intellectual property. Each Party shall keep confidential any non-public information received from the other Party in connection with this Agreement and shall use such information only for the purposes of performing or administering this Agreement, except as disclosure may be required by law.

## 7. TERMINATION

The County may terminate this Agreement, in whole or in part, at any time upon written notice to the Contractor. In such event, the Contractor shall be paid for services properly performed up to the effective date of termination. Either Party may terminate this Agreement for a material breach by the other Party if the breach is not remedied within a reasonable time after written notice specifying the breach.

## 8. GOVERNING LAW

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Province of Alberta and the applicable laws of Canada. The Parties attorn to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of Alberta in respect of any dispute arising out of or relating to this Agreement.

## 9. GENERAL TERMS

This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior discussions, representations, and understandings relating to that subject matter. No amendment to this Agreement shall be effective unless made in writing and signed by both Parties. If any provision of this Agreement is found to be invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall continue in full force and effect.
